PERTINENT AND USEFUL INFORMATION

GRADING

Below are the different categories of grading, the percentage of the overall grade, and the examples of each type.

1. Category 1: Checking for Understanding – 25%

a. Examples

- i. <u>Participation</u> Students will be graded on starting rehearsal on time, tuning, and following the instructor's lesson activities.
- ii. <u>Preparation/Practicing</u> knowing one's individual part as marked by improvement from previous class periods. This also includes bringing one's instrument home daily for violin & viola students and having an instrument at home to practice on for cello and bass students that is well tuned and in playing condition.
- iii. Theory Assignments

2. Category 2: Relevant Applications - 35%

- a. Examples
 - <u>After School Sectionals</u> Students will be required to attend after-school sectionals during the course of the school year. Sectional schedules will be given ahead of time for 1st and 2nd semesters. Sectionals are mandatory.
 - ii. Short playing tests in class or in sectionals.

3. Category 3: Summative Assessments – 40%

- a. Examples
 - i. <u>Performances</u> We are a performance class and spend a significant portion of our time preparing for public and competitive performances. Attendance at all three school concerts, Pre-UIL & UIL string orchestra competitions, and Solo/Ensemble Festival is mandatory. If a student is unable to fulfill the after-school performance obligations as listed in the orchestra calendar he or she should enroll in a different course. *See Field Trips & Eligibility section for ineligibility rules for competitions*.
 - ii. <u>Solo & Ensemble Festival</u> All students are required to participate in solo and ensemble festival in February and the preparatory recital in January. Students who are ineligible will have to make up their solo & ensemble grade via the preparatory recital.
 - iii. <u>Track Tests</u> Most weeks during the year students will be required to perform a playing test from their track packets given to them by Mr. Johnston. While some playing tests will be in taken in class in front of their classmates, a number of these will be done on <u>Smart Music</u> at home, an internet based application that gives immediate feedback to students after recording. Smart Music does not work on a smart phone but only on laptops, desktops, and tablets. If a student has trouble using Smart Music, contact Mr. Johnston about trouble shooting or recording options at the school. Track tests are on a pass/fail basis. Students who score over a 90% on their test may move on to the next track in their packet. Students who score below a 90% will need to repeat the same the track the following week. Student progress with their track tests will significantly influence placement in the different orchestras and their chair

MATERIALS NEEDED FOR CLASS

- I. <u>Instruments</u> All students will need an instrument to practice on at home. Cello and bass students can use school instruments while at Cy Creek. Violin and viola students need to bring their own purchased or rented instrumented as the school does not have an inventory of these instruments. There are a limited number of school basses and cellos for loan available to those are in financial need. *Please contact your director if applicable*. The following instruments shops are extremely reputable & service our school weekly

- II. <u>Black Binder, Track Packets, & Music</u> Students will be provided with a black three-ring binder in which they will house all of their music. All students are responsible to maintain their folders.
- III. <u>A pencil</u>!!
- IV. <u>Uniform</u> see uniform section for details.
- V. <u>Metronome</u> This can be downloaded for free on a smart phone. I recommend the Metronome+ app. You may also purchase a Korg TM-50 Combo Tuner Metronome.
- VI. <u>Tuner</u> For apps on smart phones I recommend Tonal Energy which costs \$4.

STUDENT CONDUCT

I. Students are expected to abide by all CFISD, Cy Creek High School, and Cy Creek Orchestra code of conduct standards. This applies to all curricular/extracurricular activities such as UIL performances and overnight trips. From the CFISD Code Conduct:

> With the approval of the principal and Superintendent, sponsors and coaches of extracurricular activities may develop and enforce standards of behavior that are higher than the District-developed Student Code of Conduct and may condition membership or participation in the activity on adherence to those standards. Extracurricular standards of behavior may take into consideration conduct that occurs at any time, on or off school property. Extracurricular behavioral standards shall not have the effect of discriminating on the basis of gender, race, color, disability, religion, ethnicity, or national origin. A student shall be informed of any extracurricular behavior standards at the beginning of each school year or when the student first begins participation in the activity. A student and his or her parent shall sign and return to the sponsor or coach a statement that they have read the extracurricular behavior standards and consent to them as a condition of participation in the activity. Standards of behavior for an extracurricular activity are independent of the Student Code of Conduct. Violations of these standards of behavior that are also violations of the Student Code of Conduct may result in independent disciplinary actions. A student may be removed from participation in extracurricular activities or may be excluded from school honors for violation of extracurricular standards of behavior for an activity or for violation of the Student Code of Conduct.

- II. <u>Classroom Conduct</u> Students will be held to the following standards. Repeated failure to comply with these standards will result in a referral to the appropriate Assistant Principal. Students will:
 - <u>Be Prepared</u>. This means they will have all their classroom materials at the beginning of class.

- **<u>Be Punctual</u>**. Students need to be in their seats with their instrument out on time.
- **Be Present**. This means students will be on task and engaged in the lesson.
- **Be Polite**. This means that students behave respectfully to teachers and other students in the classroom. In my classroom this means that students raise their hands and wait to be called on.

FIELD TRIPS & ELIGIBILITY

- I. Cy Creek Orchestra Field Trip Policy Field trips and orchestra outings are a great way to bond as a team and gain outside musical experiences not available in the classroom. All students are welcome to come provided that:
 - a. Students are academically eligible. Academically ineligible students are not allowed to participate per TEA, UIL, & CFISD policies.
 - b. Students have been demonstrating proper classroom decorum and have been fulfilling their after-school orchestra responsibilities. The director may choose to restrict field trip participation for the following reasons:
 - i. Unexcused absences to major events such as concerts & competitions.
 - ii. Poor classroom behavior. This includes, but is not limited to
 - 1. Multiple phone calls home for frequent disruptions such as talking/ playing out of turn or defiant and disrespectful behavior toward the director or other members of the orchestra.
 - 2. Administrative referral/referrals
 - iii. Poor attendance at after-school sectionals.
- II. UIL Eligibility
 - a. Per UIL policy students who have not maintained a 70 or higher in all of their courses are ineligible to participate in UIL competitions and events such as Solo and Ensemble Contest in February. However, due to recent changes in UIL policy students who are not passing all their class <u>will</u> be able to perform at both Pre UIL and UIL Concert and Sight Reading Competition. Students can regain eligibility at the appropriate progress report/report card. Being UIL ineligible does not exclude a student from participating in <u>school concerts</u> since a concert is part of a student's assessment in a music class, but does pertain to Region Orchestra Auditions and Clinic, Solo/Ensemble Festival, and UIL String Orchestra Contest. Help us out by staying on top of your coursework!

REMIND & OTHER INFORMATION

- <u>Remind</u>- Mr. Johnston uses an anonymous texting program called Remind to communicate with parents and students about upcoming events and assignments. Instructions for joining the different groups are listed below.
 - Parent Orchestra Remind Text the message @creekorch to the number 81010.
 - **Philharmonic Orchestra** Text the message @3philhar to the number 81010.
 - **Concert Orchestra -** Text the message @4concert to the number 81010.
 - Symphony Orchestra- Text the message @2symph to the number 81010.
 - Chamber Orchestra- Text the message @1cham to the number 81010.

- We ask that all our students keep their fingernails cut short. Long nails and/or fake nails contribute to bad hand posture and will not be allowed. Please help us enforce this rule and don't believe that the student can play "as well" with them.
- Every effort was made to give you as many dates and times ahead as possible, but dates and times may change and some opportunities cannot be forefold.

UNIFORMS

Students will be issued a formal concert uniform at the beginning of each year. We only purchase new uniforms once every 10 years, so it is imperative that they remain in good condition. It is the responsibility of the student to maintain these items throughout the school year. In order to preserve the uniforms students will dress before concerts at school and return the uniforms after the concert to the wardrobe room in the orchestra hall. <u>No uniforms are to</u> <u>be taken home!</u> Students will be charged for any damaged uniforms returned at the end of each year.

- <u>Gentleman</u> will receive a tuxedo jacket, pants, cummerbund, and bow tie but must purchase their own tuxedo shirt, black socks, and black dress shoes.
- <u>Ladies</u> will receive a dress/gown. Ladies are responsible for the appropriate black dress shoes. No open-toe footwear please!

PRIVATE LESSONS & SCHOLARSHIPS

Private lessons combined with regular practice dramatically improve skills and contribute to a deep satisfaction in playing one's instrument. Many of our top students take private lessons. Please consider enrolling your student in district lessons or choosing from our excellent list of local instructors. All the information for private lessons is available on the private lessons tab on the website.

Last year we were able to sponsor 5 half-tuition scholarships to students at our school. This year we plan to provide 10 such scholarships.

EQUIPMENT

A student's instrument, bow, or strings can dramatically impact his or her sound and enjoyment in playing. Incoming 9th graders should consider stepping up to a higher quality instrument and getting resized. Strings only last so long. <u>All violin, viola students should buy</u> <u>a pack of strings from the recommended list on our website and change their strings if</u> <u>this hasn't been done in the past year! Cellos and basses should change their strings</u> <u>every 1.5 to 2 years.</u> Please see the website under the "Other Information" tab for more details.
